Donner Summit Lodge, A Short History

Ever since the Dutch Flat Wagon Rd. was built in the early 1860's to service the building of the Transcontinental Railroad, there have been hostelrys along the route over Donner Pass.

The first auto to cross Donner Pass crossed in 1901. The first successful motorized "transcontinentalist" crossed the country using Donner Pass in 1903 on a motor bicycle. With the arrival of the automobile, lodges began to spring up to service automobiles and provide relief for the "autoists".

By 1913 the first transcontinental highway, the Lincoln Highway, was in operation and auto traffic increased considerably. In 1913 there were 150 "transcontinentalists" and by 1923 the number had increased to 25,000. Small lodges and service stations were built along the route and early automobiles would have gone right past what is now Donner Summit Lodge. Once the highway was open in winter the lodges offered accommodations for snow sport enthusiasts.

Donner Summit Lodge was built in 1938 to take advantage of the growth of traffic over the, by then, year-round Highway 40. The lodge was expanded twice from the picture above, first just after World War II and then in the 1970's. Additions were made to both ends of the original lodge. The sign on the lodge above says, "Donner Summit Lodge Fine Food Ski Dormitories Cabins.."

Donner Summit Is Magnificent

People have been saying that for a long time. The Native Americans apparently appreciated the beauty. They kept coming back to summer here year after year, decade after decade, century after century for thousands of years. More convincing though is that all the petroglyph sites have wonderful views of nearby peaks. There is not one site, of dozens, that does not have a spectacular view.

The first diarists with the wagon trains began the tradition of remarking on the beauty. Some visitors were almost rhapsodic in their praise.

In 1846 Edwin Bryant said, "The Alps, so celebrated in history, and by all travelers and admirers of mountain landscape, cannot, I am satisfied, present scenery more wild, more rugged more grand, more romantic, and more enchantingly picturesque and beautiful, than that which surround this lake [Donner Lake.... The view is at the top is]...inexpressibly comprehensive, grand, and picturesque. After congratulating ourselves upon the safe achievement of our morning feat, and breathing our mules a few minutes, we proceeded on our journey."

John Steel, in 1850, said, "A short distance north of the pass I climbed the dizzy heights of a granite peak. The view was magnificent."

In June 13, 1885 the California Spirit of the Times magazine said, "The air has a fresh crispness about it that gives a new life to the visitor whether he has come from the fertile plains or the foggy city. And no wonder...there are seven thousand feet between you and sea level. Seven thousand feet nearer heaven and so much nearer purity. It is a relief to... look up to the stars, nowhere brighter than here, with only the dark pines closing in the distance... The air redolent with the perfume of fresh grass and wild flowers; and aromatic with pine needles. It is a physical pleasure to breathe, a 'delight to exist'... It is small wonder that a millionaire [Mark Hopkins]... should confess to be happier and healthier here than in the handsomest house on California Street. Nob Hill, to the sierras indeed."

Mary Ann Graves was a member of the Donner Party and one of the "Forlorn Hope" which escaped Donner Lake. They slogged through the snow and climbed to the top of Donner Pass. They were starving and exhausted but the view overcame the exhaustion. She said, "The scenery was too grand for me to pass without notice." She remembered another member of the group saying, "We were as near to heaven as we could get."

Thornton Round was 14 in 1914 when his father took him and the rest of the family across the country by automobile: "I don't believe I have adequate words to describe the real beauty of Donner Pass. As we stood looking down I had a floating sensation... I lost all fear as I looked at one of the most beautiful blue lakes [Donner Lake] I had ever seen. Everything below us seemed suspended in shimmering light."

It Wasn't Just the Men

People have been crossing Donner Summit for thousands of years. The first emigrants crossed it to improve their lives as did later emigrants using the first transcontinental railroad and then the highways.

Once personalized motor vehicles, automobiles, motorcycles and even bicycles were available, people started to travel for adventure and pleasure. It was not easy initially for automobilists, motorcyclists or bicyclists and they were mostly men with lots of testosterone.

In an earlier menu we covered Thomas Stevens who was the first to cross the Sierra, cross the country, and go around the world by bicycle. We covered George Wyman who was the first to cross the country on a motor bicycle in 1903. Alexander Winton was the first to cross the Sierra by automobile in 1901.

There were also women, though, who crossed Donner Summit. Anita King, a movie actress, was the first to cross the country unaccompanied in her car (to meet the rules of the time) but accompanied by a film crew that filmed footage for a 1915 movie, "The Race." She crossed the country in 48 days. The next year Amanda Preuss crossed the country unaccompanied in her car, and unaccompanied by a film crew, in 11 days.

It was the women motorcyclists who were really adventurous. They had no cars to camp in and had even less protection from the elements (the first autos had no windows or tops to keep out the elements).

The Van Buren sisters were not Victorian ladies. They boxed, swam, ice skated, canoed, etc. and won awards for their efforts. In 1916 they saw

America heading for war and wanted to be motorcycle dispatch riders for the Army. To get publicity to help ready America for war and to bolster the standing of women for Army duty, they decided to ride across the country. They rode up Pike's Pk, experienced heat, storms, rain, washouts, wrecked bridges, landslides, and sometimes got so tired they fell asleep while riding and fell over in the mud. They crossed the country and Donner Summit. They did not get to be motorcycle dispatch riders in WWI.

Most endearing maybe was Effie Hotchkiss, who must have been a "pistol." As a girl she baked weekly cakes for the neighboring fire dept. who were supposed to be helping her become a lady but the lessons didn't take given her purchase of one mo-

torcycle after another and her attempted elopement. Then she got the idea to ride across the country to San Francisco to the Panama Pacific Exhibition in 1915. She decided to take her mother with her in the sidecar of her motorcycle.

Effie's trip was the first round-trip of the continent by motorcycle but it did not get much publicity because it was overshadowed by WWI and the Lusitania sinking.

She needed a pistol for the trip. New York's purchase laws were a bit strict but the salesperson noted that it would be easier in New Jersey. So Effie reflected that New Jersey did not seem to care who got shot as long as it was done in "good clean fun."

Effie's mother drove her crazy with her tatting (making lace). "I loved my mother very much but was often tempted to commit mayhem with that tatting shuttle." A rain storm occasioned, "A resurrected Noah dashing by in his ark would not have

Donner Summit Lodge has been sitting alongside Old Highway 40 since 1938. Before the lodge the space was not empty though.

Just across the street from the lodge is a dirt road which used to be the Lincoln Highway. Travelers along the Lincoln Highway and then along Highway 40 needed gas and a gas station was built on the property. At the same time fox furs were popular with women and people began to breed foxes to supply the industry.

George Fraley had come into possession of some Donner Summit land in 1913. In 1925 the State decided to reline the highway and was going to sell off some parcels of land at auction. Fraley and some friends bought the various parcels and then drew papers from a hat to see who got which parcels. Fraley won the best piece, a half section, which had the new highway on it. Fraley ran the Fox Farm and in 1946 opened up the Soda Springs Grocery store which sat across the street from the current store.


